The Virginia Land Conservation Foundation Announces the FY2022 grant round.

The Virginia Land Conservation Foundation is pleased to announce a new grant round to support land conservation efforts across the Commonwealth. The grant round consists of \$7.5 million, divided equally into five grant categories: farmland preservation, forestland preservation, historic preservation, natural area protection, and open spaces and parks.

We look forward to receiving your applications and to working with you to accomplish the projects that are important to your organizations and those that will help to conserve the priority lands identified within Governor Northam's Conserve Virginia initiative. State agencies, localities, and non-profit conservation entities are eligible to apply.

Application deadline is Monday, August 9, 2021 at 4p.m.
